Neighbors are talking _ to each other

New online links between neighborhoods in northeast Lee County are allowing people to share opinions, warn about suspicious activity and even find someone to watch their dog while they travel.

The links are individual neighborhood groups formed at Nextdoor.com.
Ten neighborhoods are active in Fort Myers
Shores, Alva and nearby parts of Lehigh Acres.
Matters of interest to each neighborhood or of a regional interest can be shared.

Alva.nextdoor.com formed in June and has 132 members in 115 households. The Fort Myers Shores neighborhood has 135 members and was



formed in 2014. The Kitty Hawk neighborhood (14 members) and River Hall (13 members) began in 2013.

Free admission to the groups is controlled by a person's address. Your address must be within the neighborhood you chose to join.

If no neighborhood group exists one can be started on Nextdoor.com. The person who starts the group gets to define the boundaries.

Nextdoor neighborhoods are located in Alva, Fort Myers Shores, Wellington, Greenbrier, Hawks Preserve, Kitty Hawk, Hampton Boulevard, River Hall, Marlay Avenue and between 68th and 75th streets West.

Here are some of the topics discussed in the past month: a suspicious vehicle in a driveway at 3 a.m., fun places to go, a bobcat siting, site choice for East Zone high school, Alva craft show date, a new bait shop opening, Alva United Methodist Church cookbook sale, furniture for sale, fundraiser for the Alva Museum and the Sheriff's Office job fair.

The museum dates to 1909. It was Lee County's first public library. Visitors can find artifacts from Ice Age mammoth teeth to hand tools, clothing and furniture used by Alva's founding families.

The museum is open from 2-4 p.m. on Saturdays from October to May.
